Inviting Fathers In

who enters our clinic must be at the forefront of our minds. Each pregnancy involves a mother, baby, and father. Last year brought some changes as we realized we could do better in the area of serving fathers.

The father of the baby plays an important role in the pregnant mother's life. For many, he is the number one influencer in her decision to give birth or have an abortion. A majority of women who choose abortion do so because they are having relationship problems with the father or they do not want to be a single mom. By welcoming him into the appointment, we can better find out what he's thinking and what his needs are as far as becoming a father. He may feel inadequate, intimidated and overwhelmed. We want to empower him with encouragement and resources so that he feels capable of making a life-affirming decision.

When both mother and father choose to parent, we encourage them to participate together in the Parenting Initiative program. Their involvement in the program will continue our ability to be of help with uncertainties and needs, and also give them tools in welcoming and parenting their baby.

Unusual Circumstances

At Hope, we serve a wide array of women with diverse backgrounds and needs. Some are pretty straight forward and others involve unusually complicated situations.

Dora* is in the latter group. She is living with her parents and already has one child. She says she is a Christian. Her pregnancy test reveals she is pregnant and she initially says she's undecided about what she wants to do. Parenting and abortion are both on the table.

Where Dora's story gets especially messy is with the father of the baby. He comes with Dora for that first visit to Hope, and he clearly wants her to have an abortion. He has two other children with another woman with whom he is currently living. The Hope advocate asks them both some open questions and helps them have a healthy, positive conversation about their difficult situation.

Dora calls back a few days later and asks if she can come in again, and asks if she can bring her sister. When they arrive, the father of the baby is with them. He says he plans to stay with his other family, but will help provide for this baby as well. Dora says she is looking forward to parenting her baby.

What occurs to us here at Hope is, "What happens to this baby if Hope wasn't here for this couple?"

Hope served more women in 2023 than ever before. We are honored that women are choosing to come to Hope when they make their pregnancy decision, and choosing to stay with us for parenting classes. Our staff and volunteers show each woman love, truth, and compassion in every step along the way.

Our volunteer advocates in the clinic work with our medical staff in the moment of decision. They ask good questions and listen well. Volunteer mentors in the Parenting Initiative meet weekly with the mother, and more frequently, the father as well to go over the curriculum that will help these parents be successful and thrive.

We have an on-going need for more volunteers both advocates and mentors—to fill the needs of our increasing patient load. Do you have a compassionate heart? An ability to listen well and speak truth with kindness? If you've considered volunteering at Hope, now would be a great time.
