In a remarkable twist, these lost ones come right up to our front door and ask us straight out to help them. Our staff and volunteers are ready to give what they need—truth, wrapped in love. But what they need even more is grace, unconditional acceptance, and hope for a way forward. In God's power, we give them that, too. Like Jesus carrying the one lost lamb slung across his shoulders, it is common to see here the many being embraced and lifted to a hopeful future.

Of course, we don't see all of their problems solved in a single hour but we do often get to plant a seed that can grow into a healthy, even bright future. That's another parable, maybe for another time.

Many of the lost souls at Hope enroll in our Parenting Initiative where they encounter an abundance of mercy and lovingkindness. Some come in still very broken, and receive six weeks (or 12 or 18 weeks) of unconditional love. In this safe place, many lives experience

Devoted to Prayer

Every Tuesday morning the Hope staff gather in the lobby for prayer time. We spend a few precious minutes lifting up each other, our patients, and the ministry of Hope to our Heavenly Father. The medical staff and volunteers pray almost every morning for the patients coming in that day. Throughout every day we pray for each other and patients we know are in hard situations. Board members are praying for this ministry during—and

in between—board meetings. Prayers are going out from Hope all the time. We also know that prayers are being spoken over Hope all through our community, surrounding cities, and even beyond the borders of Marion and Polk counties. Faithful partners of Hope, some of whom have moved out of state, support Hope through prayer.

While we do occasionally send out specific prayer requests in a "prayer blast" email*, some needs are constant. Here are some things we continually lay before the Lord in prayer:
